The Nepalese football community in Australia is vibrant and growing, with over 50+ clubs nationwide. In Sydney alone, there are more than 30+ active clubs, of which 22 teams compete in the league competition across two divisions — 12 teams in the First Division and 10 in the Second Division. The league runs for approximately six months each year, and all clubs are governed by the Australian Nepalese Football Association (ANFA).

In addition to the league, numerous one-day and two-day tournaments are held annually. Highlights include the Machhapuchhre Cup, organised by Machhapuchhre Football Club at Valentine Sports Park, and multiple tournaments at Rydalmere Park.

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY, TEAM FORMATION & TOURNAMENT RULES

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY RULES

A Division / National League Players

- As per the ANFA Australia rule a maximum of **3 players** who have played in any of the following in the last **3 years (since 9th October 2022)** may be fielded at any one time:
 - o Nepal A Division League
 - o Nepal National Team
 - o Australian A-League
- This rule applies to all teams (Open Age & 35+), including interstate teams.
- Former A Division/National player whose last match was before 9th October 2022 must obtain a clearance email from ANFA Australia.
- Players should coordinate with their respective clubs for assistance in obtaining this
 clearance.

REGISTERED PLAYERS

- Only registered players may participate.
- Players **must play exclusively** for the team they are registered with.
- NSW-based players and teams will be monitored by ANFA for compliance.

PLAYER ORIGIN REQUIREMENT

All players must be of Nepalese or Bhutanese origin.





LOAN PLAYER RULES (NSW TEAMS ONLY

General

• All players must be **18 years** or older to participate.

Open Age Category For NSW Teams

- Teams may take up to 3 loan players from other NSW ANFA-registered clubs.
- Loans must be approved and recorded on the ANFA website or as per the ANFA Australia rules on portal.

- Notification must be sent to:

Loan Deadline

All loan requests must be submitted by:

Friday, 10 October 2025 11:00 PM

*No loan requests will be accepted after this date.

TEAM FORMATION

- a) Each team will consist of a **maximum of 16 players, 1 manager**, and **1 coach**.
 - Coach and manager cannot play unless registered as part of the 16-player squad.
- b) Each team will field **9 players** during the game:
 - 1 goalkeeper (allowed to use hands within their goalkeeping area)
 - 8 outfield players
- c) Six (6) substitutions are allowed per game.
 - Once substituted, a player cannot re-enter the game.
- d) Substitutions can only be made from the designated area and only after the player being replaced has left the field.
- e) The **minimum number of players** required to start a match is **6**.
 - If a team cannot field 6 players, the opposing team will be declared the winner.
- f) Teams must report at least 30 minutes before kickoff.
- If a team cannot field their team within 5 minutes after kickoff, the opposing team will be given a 1-goal advantage. Decision will be made by referees.
- If a team still fails to field their team within 10 minutes of kickoff, the opposing team will be declared the winner with a 3–0 scoreline.
- If **both team** fail to arrive on time, their playing time will be reduced as per their arrival time.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

GROUP STAGE

- 16 Teams, divided into 4 Groups (A, B, C, D)
- Each team plays 3 group matches.
- Top 2 teams from each group qualify for Quarter Finals.

QUARTER FINAL

- 12 minutes per half
- Matchups:

o Q1: Winner Group A VS Runner-Up Group B

o Q2: Winner Group B VS Runner-Up Group A

o Q3: Winner Group C VS Runner-Up Group D

o Q4: Winner Group D VS Runner-Up Group C

SEMI FINAL

- **☼** 15 minutes per half
- Matchups:

o S1: Winner Q1 VS Winner Q3

o S2: Winner Q2 VS Winner Q4

FINAL

o Winner S1 VS Winner S2

Match length: Same as Semi-Finals (unless otherwise decided by organizers).

PENALTY TIEBREAKER

- After group stage matches, if a game ends in a draw, the result will be decided by a penalty shootout.
- Each team will select 4 penalty takers to take penalties alternately.
- If still tied after 4 penalties each, the shootout will continue sudden death until a winner is decided.



POINTS SYSTEM

• Win: 3 points

• Draw (before penalty shootout): 1 point

• Loss: O points

TIEBREAKER CRITERIA

If two or more teams are tied on points:

- 1. Points earned in all group matches
- 2. Head-to-head result between tied teams.
- 3. Goal difference in all group matches
- 4. Total goals scored in all group matches
- 5. Disciplinary points:

o Yellow card = 1 point

o Red card (2 yellows) = 3 points

o Direct red = 3 points

o Yellow + direct red = 4 points

*Team with fewer points ranks higher

6. Drawing of lots (random draw by officials) /Coin Toss

SPECIAL RULES

Offside Rule

• No offside rule will apply in this tournament.

DISCIPLINE & ABANDONED GAMES

Conduct Expectations

- Tournament must be played in good spirit.
- Anti-social behaviour and violence will NOT be tolerated.
- Captains and Managers are responsible for the conduct and safety of their team members.
- Referees will **only communicate with captains** during disputes.

Game Abandonment

- Referees may abandon matches due to anti-social behaviour or violence.
- If a team is at fault, they may be expelled from this tournament and future Beni FC



Tournaments

- If a match is abandoned because a team **cannot field enough players**:
- Opposing team (with sufficient players) will be awarded a 3-0 win

INJURIES & TREATMENT

• First Aid will be provided, but clubs are responsible for player insurance including Ambulance.



DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

Any person who causes damage to the pitch, its facilities, car park, or any part of the venue will he:

- o Eiected from the area
- o Reported to the Police (if necessary)
- All costs will be charged to the person(s) found guilty.

LIABILITY

- **Injuries:** Beni FC is not responsible for any injuries. Teams must secure their own accident and personal injury insurance.
- **Rule Communication:** Team managers must ensure their players understand all tournament rules, which will also be explained during the registration process.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- 1. Apart from the outlined rules, general FIFA football rules apply.
 - o Any omissions or alterations will be clarified by referees on the tournament day.
 - o In case of any dispute, the referee's and the organizing committee's decision is final.
- 2. Alcohol and smoking are strictly prohibited within the venue perimeter.
 - o Violations will result in severe penalties.
- 3. Beni FC reserves the right to make changes to schedules, rules, and regulations with prior notice to teams.

By participating in the Beni FC Football Carnival, teams agree to abide by these rules and regulations.

OVER THE AGE OF 35 (FOREVER YOUNG) THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE OVER 35 TOURNAMENTS ARE THE SAME EXCEPT:

- Born October 10,1990 or Prior will be considered as 35+.
- Teams may take up to 5 loan players from other NSW ANFA-registered clubs.
- Loans must be approved and recorded on the ANFA website or as per the ANFA Australia rules on portal.
- Notification must be sent to- ANFA Australia

email or verbally via phone or face to face.

- Loan Deadline
 - All loan requests must be submitted by:
 Friday, 10 October 2025 11:00 PM
 - *No loan requests will be accepted after this date.
- If required, players in the over 35 competitions must provide proof of age. Only physical Australian
 driving license, any passport will be accepted as proof of age. Nepali/Bhutanese driving license will
 not be accepted as proof of age. If not, the organizing committee has the right to disallow such player
 from participating in the tournament.
- If any team fields an underage player and is unable to provide proof of age, such team will be disqualified from the tournament. Three points will be given to opposing team that makes official protest within 15 mins after the game finishes.
- Team/s can also ask for proof of age from the opposing team/s before the start of each game. When
 such request is made, the player/s in question must present their proof of age immediately after the
 said match. If proof of age is not presented, the team that Fielded underage player will be disqualified
 from the tournament.
- Protest must be made within 15 mins of the game. Any protest after 15 mins will not be entertained.
 - Once official protest is received, organizing committee will officially request the proof of age from the team that has Fielded underage player. Such team must provide proof of age within 30 mins of receiving official communication. official communication can be in the form of SMS, messenger,
